Notes from the Week

Reading

We are continuing to work on reading and writing words with long vowels and silent e. The students read a folktale about how leopards got their spots. They wrote about the sequence of events in the story and discussed the lesson that was learned by the characters.

Math

This week, we learned about using position words and ordinal numbers to describe locations and positions. Next week, we will begin working on place value and ordering numbers.

Religion

In religion, we read the story of the Wise Men and talked about the meaning for each of the gifts they brought to Jesus: gold because Jesus is King, frankincense because Jesus is God, and myrrh because Jesus is man. We also talked about the Holy Family and how our families can share in many of the same things that Jesus, Mary, and Joseph did together.

Science/Social Studies

In Social Studies, the students learned that the purpose of government is to help its citizens and to facilitate people working together. Students learned about voting and the men who fill the offices of mayor, governor, and president in our local, state, and national governments.
